October Spotlights

Board Member Spotlight WILLIAM FORD OVERTON

William Ford Overton was born on April 27, 1966, in the city of Little Rock, Arkansas, as the eldest son of Bill and Susan Overton. His late father, William R. Overton, held the esteemed position of Federal District (Eastern District) Judge. Ford's former years were spent in the charming surroundings of Little Rock, culminating in his high school graduation from Catholic High School in 1985. Subsequently, he pursued higher education at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in History in 1989.



The commencement of Ford's professional journey led him to Stephens, Inc., based in his hometown of Little Rock, where he devoted approximately one year to his career. Thereafter, he transitioned to Rineco Chemical Industries, situated in Haskell, Arkansas, and dedicated his skills and expertise to the company until May of 2003. In July 2003, Ford embarked on a new chapter by acquiring West Tree Service Inc. in Little Rock. He assumed the roles of owner, operator, and CEO, a responsibility he discharged with distinction until April 26, 2021. Although he sold the company to a private equity group, Ford continues to offer his valuable insights and guidance as a consultant to the firm.

Ford's commitment to his community has been unwavering over the past three decades. He has generously devoted his time and effort in volunteer capacities for various esteemed organizations, including the Red Cross of Greater Arkansas for 10 years, the Arkansas Game and Fish Foundation for an impressive 20 years, and the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission for a notable 7-year term, during which he was appointed by then-Governor Mike Beebe. Presently, he is actively serving on the UAMS Foundation Board.



In his personal life, Ford is happily married to his college sweetheart, Stephanie Hardy Overton, and they are celebrating 33 years of marital bliss this November. The couple has been blessed with three daughters, two of whom are 25-year-old twins, and the youngest is 23. Their joy multiplied on July 20, 2023, with the arrival of their precious grandchild, Tatum Ford Talbert.

Trooper Retiree Spotlight

In this month's newsletter trooper retiree spotlight, we are proud to highlight an individual whose dedication to public service has spanned decades and taken on many different forms. Meet Sheriff Aubry D. Cook, a remarkable individual with a diverse and impressive career history.

Arkansas State Police Service:

Cook's journey in the Arkansas State Police commenced on February 8, 1988, when he began his service as a Trooper. Over the course of his tenure, he has dedicated a significant portion of his life to serving and protecting the people of Arkansas. His illustrious career with the ASP spans over 22 years as a Commissioned Officer. Cook's duty assignments are a testament to his commitment:

- Nov 1, 1990 Dec 31, 2010: Troop C, Mississippi County
- Feb 8, 1988 Oct 31, 1990: Troop A, Little Rock



In November 2010, Cook was elected as the Sheriff of Mississippi County. This transition into county leadership showcases their dedication to the law enforcement community.

Military Service:

Cook's contributions go beyond the realm of state law enforcement. He served in the military for 32 years, retiring honorably on June 5, 2003, with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel (LTC). Among his numerous accomplishments, Cook was awarded the prestigious Bronze Star during Operation Desert Storm in 1991, a testament to his bravery and commitment. Furthermore, he received a Certificate of Appreciation from President George Bush in 2003, highlighting his exceptional contributions to our country.

Educational Achievements:

Cook's pursuit of knowledge and professional development is evident through their educational accomplishments. He earned an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from Arkansas Northeastern College in 1997. Prior to that, he completed several criminal justice courses at the University of Memphis from 1980 to 1982. In 1976, he earned an AA degree in computer programming from Southern Arkansas University Tech, showcasing his versatility. His educational journey began in 1972 when he graduated from ASU Extended Campus, Marked Tree, AR, with a focus on Clerical Office Occupations.
